#### THIRD SUNDAY IN ADVENT

Sometimes life requires the astonishing patience of Job. Like him, we are to rejoice in the midst of affliction, be grounded in repentance under the cross of Christ, and hope relentlessly in His resurrection, that we might see the purpose of the Lord, how the Lord is compassionate and merciful. In the promise of the Gospel, therefore, be patient and establish your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is at hand. Like St. John the Baptist, whatever your own kind of prison or suffering may be, call upon Jesus and receive the strength of His Word from those He sends to you. For as the blind receive their sight and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised up, so is the Good News of Jesus preached to you also. He comes and restores the fortunes of Zion, His Holy Church, so that sorrow and sighing shall flee away.



OLD TESTAMENT: Isaiah 35:1-10

The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad; the desert shall rejoice and blossom like the crocus; it shall blossom abundantly and rejoice with joy and singing. The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon. They shall see the glory of the LORD, the majesty of our God. Strengthen the weak hands, and make firm the feeble knees. Say to those who have an anxious heart, "Be strong; fear not! Behold, your God will come with vengeance, with the recompense of God. He will come and save you." Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped; then shall the lame man leap like a deer, and the tongue of the mute sing for joy. For waters break forth in the wilderness, and streams in the desert; the burning sand shall become a pool, and the thirsty ground springs of water; in the haunt of jackals, where they lie down, the grass shall become reeds and rushes. And a highway shall be there, and it shall be called the Way of Holiness; the unclean shall not pass over it. It shall belong to those who walk on the way; even if they are fools, they shall not go astray. No lion shall be there, nor shall any ravenous beast come up on it; they shall not be found there, but the redeemed shall walk there. And the ransomed of the LORD shall return and come to Zion with singing; everlasting joy shall be upon their heads; they shall obtain gladness and joy, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away.

not grumble against one another, brothers, so that you may not be judged; behold, the Judge is standing at the door. As an example of suffering and patience, brothers, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord. Behold, we consider those blessed who remained steadfast. You have heard of the steadfastness of Job, and you have seen the purpose of the Lord, how the Lord is compassionate and merciful.

When John heard in prison about the deeds of the Christ, he sent word by his disciples and said to him, "Are you the one who is to come, or shall we look for another?" And Jesus answered them, "Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind receive their sight and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised up, and the poor have good news preached to them. And blessed is the one who is not offended by me."

As they went away, Jesus began to speak to the crowds concerning John: "What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed shaken by the wind? "What then did you go out to see? A man dressed in soft clothing? Behold, those who wear soft clothing are in kings' houses. What then did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. This is he of whom it is written,

"Behold, I send my messenger before your face,

who will prepare your way before you.'

Truly, I say to you, among those born of women there has arisen no one greater than John the Baptist. Yet the one who is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he. From the days of John the Baptist until now the kingdom of heaven has suffered violence, and the violent take it by force. For all the Prophets and the Law prophesied until John, and if you are willing to accept it, he is Elijah who is to come. He who has ears to hear, let them hear."

#### ♦ STATEMENT of FAITH: Nicene Creed







If you are not a confirmed member of an LCMS congregation, we are thankful for your presence today and warmly invite you to come forward for a blessing, indicating this by crossing your arms over your chest as the pastor approaches. 



#### The Rose Candle and the Joy That Cannot Fade

Rose is used only twice each year, and always within seasons that call the Church to repentance and preparation. The Third Sunday in Advent, called Gaudete Sunday, includes a time for rejoicing that has been long recognized since the Middle Ages. Rose does not replace the character of Advent, nor does it set aside the season's call to watchfulness. Instead, it reflects the ancient custom of lightening the tone at the midpoint of a penitential season in order to remind the faithful that, even amid sorrow and repentance, the joy of Christ and His coming cannot be eclipsed. Therefore, the rose-colored Third Sunday in Advent points us forward toward the comfort that Christ has won for His people on the cross. So too, it assures us that our hope in Him remains joyful even as we prepare our hearts for His coming.

## Advent Midweek Sermon Series Wednesdays at 6:00 PM

"The Lies of Christmas: What Satan Wants You to Believe This Advent" During the holy season of Advent, the Church watches and waits for the coming of her Lord. Advent is a season of repentance and expectation in which we hear the preaching of John the Baptist and lift our eyes toward the appearing of Christ, who once came in humility, who now comes through His Word and Sacraments, and who will come again in glory. In these weeks before Christmas, the Church deliberately resists the world's rush into sentiment and excess, so that our hearts may be renewed in faith and fixed on the One who comes to save.

This year our midweek Advent services will confront the falsehoods that the evil one uses to distort our hope and distract our hearts. Each week we will expose one of the common lies of our age, so that our hearts may be turned to repentance and anchored in the truth of Christ, who is our Light in the darkness.

The Lie: Christmas Is Only for the Merry

This lie echoes through a culture that celebrates surface level joy, telling you to hide your grief, silence your loneliness, and mask your exhaustion, because honest sorrow is treated as a threat to everyone else's cheer.
